<ul> <li>Bring 'em on.</li> <li>Be careful. Don't let your questions lead you astray.</li> <li>Questions are signs of doubt. And doubt is a sin.</li> <li>Questions are signs you are thinking. And thinking is good.</li> </ul>
In Judaism, to have a question is not a sign of doubt but a sign of spiritual depth.
