Read Luke 12:54-56.

How do you explain such a high percentage of people not seeing and/or acknowledging racism?

Before Dr. Seuss wrote <u>The Sneetches</u> (1961) he had drawn some very racist cartoons. He later regretted them and reformed.

How have you changed your views of discrimination over the years? Or have you remained how you were?

Read Matthew 15:24-28.

What troubles you about this story? How would you describe Jesus' response to the woman?

What do you think is going on here?

Jesus is testing the woman.

Jesus is exposing the racism of his culture.

Jesus is giving the disciples a real-life look at how they really are.

Jesus is revealing his own cultural racism.
